


A The Late Show

The text below is a magazine article.

First prize – a camel!

One of the last automobile adventures in the world, the Germany-to-Jordan Rally, starts in the Allgäu in southern Germany, crosses 11 countries and finally ends in Amman in Jordan. It is such a lot of fun that the number of teams taking part increased from just a handful in the first rally in 2006 to over 80 teams in 2009! The main idea behind the rally is to make contact with other cultures, increase international understanding and raise money for a good cause.



Information for participants:

- It costs €111.11 per person to take part.
- There can be 4-6 members in a team.
- Only cars that are at least 20 years old or that don't cost more than €1,111.11 are allowed to take part.
- The cars will be left in Jordan, sold there and the money will be given to a good cause.
- All costs (food, drink, return flight, etc.) must be covered by the teams themselves.
- The team members are only allowed to spend the nights in tents, or in places that cost less than €10 per night.
- The teams have to plan their own route to Jordan and are not allowed to use the main highways.
- Mobile phones are allowed, but GPS navigation systems are not.
- There will be special tasks on the way. The winner is the team that completes the largest number of tasks.
- The rally is not a race. Fun is the most important thing!
- The first prize is a camel. The camel must stay in Jordan, but can be visited at any time by the winners.

Kirsten Voss and her brother André were part of a team that took part in last year's rally. They bought a 22-year-old Mercedes for €1,000, and in May they left Oberstaufen in southern Germany on the 6,000-kilometre drive to Amman. Before they left, they collected clothes, children's toys and other useful things from friends and neighbours to give to poor or hungry people on the way. "We were only allowed to drive on small roads, and we slept in tents," said Kirsten. "We shared the driving and drove for 15 hours a day, sometimes with temperatures of up to 45 degrees and often across country where there were no roads! It took us 11 days."

In Amman they were welcomed by Princess Bama Bint Talal, the King of Jordan's sister, and there was a big celebration. Afterwards they stayed in Jordan as guests of the state for five days, and got to know the country and its people. The cars were sold and the money was given to a Bedouin village to build a cheese factory, where the poor people of the region can work and earn a living. They will be taught by experts from the Allgäu.

"It was hard," said Kirsten, "but it was a great experience. We had a lot of fun, saw many different landscapes and met some wonderful people. Now I'm looking forward to next year."



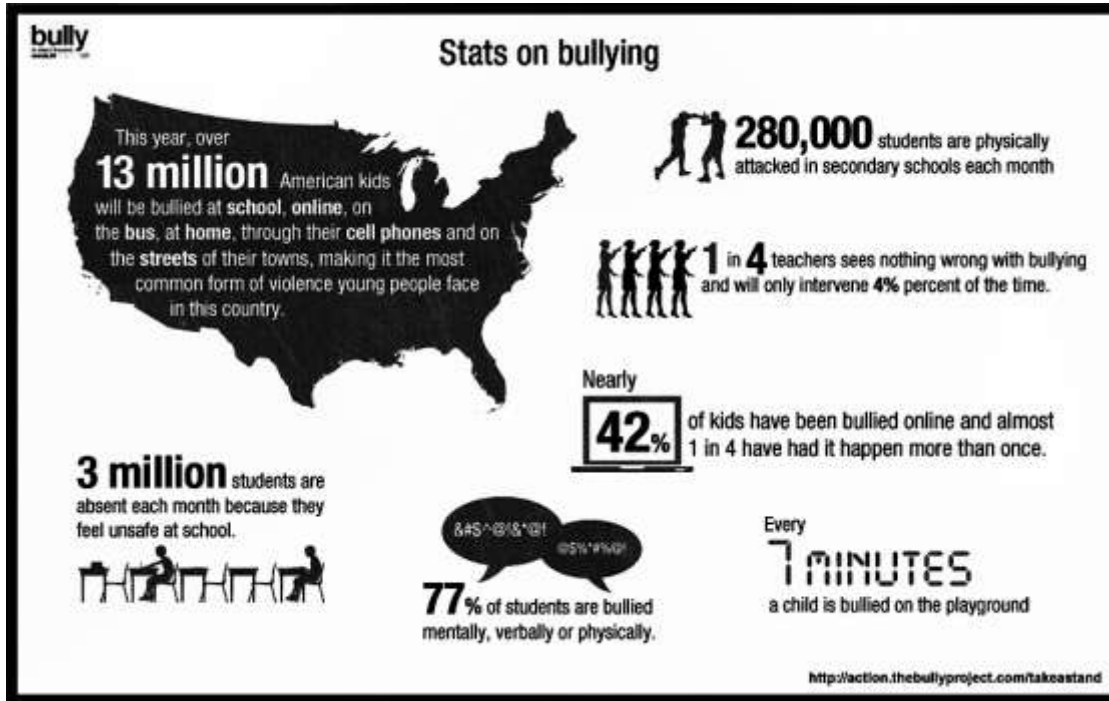
